### **III. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

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The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

- The level of the Athlete category (National, D, C, B, A) (Art.519)
- The achievement of a number of Minimum Eligibility Requirements according to the eligibility matrix of requirements (Art. 520)

### **Young Horse Championship 6 years old**

Obtain an MER according to 2026 FEI Eventing Rules, article 517 criteria as a combination between 01 January 2025 to 22 September 2026 at **1 CCI2\*-S** with the following additional criteria:

- zero obstacle penalties on XC (The 1st activation of a frangible /deformable device (11 penalties) or having 1 Missed flag (9 penalties) will still allow a MER.)
- max 4 penalties on obstacles (max one rail down) in the Jumping test

### **Young Horse Championship 7 years old**

Obtain MERs according to 2026 FEI Eventing Rules, article 517 criteria as a combination between 01 January 2025 to 22 September 2026 at **1 CCI2\*-L** and **1 CCI3\*-S** with the following additional criteria:

- both with zero obstacle penalties on XC (The 1st activation of a frangible /deformable device (11 penalties) or having 1 Missed flag (9 penalties) will still allow a MER.)
- both with max 4 penalties on obstacles (max one rail down) in the Jumping test

In addition to the above requirements, combinations must meet the MERs for CCI3\*-L as per article 520. For Uncategorised Athletes, this would result in obtaining an additional MER at CCI3\*-S.

### **FEI Eventing Rules. Article 517 – Minimum Eligibility Requirement**

A Minimum Eligibility Requirement is achieved by completing a Competition within minimum parameters of all round performance as follows:

a) Dressage Test: not more than 45 penalty points (or 55%).

b) Cross Country Test:

- A clear round at obstacles (activating a maximum of one frangible device or having a maximum of one missing flag will maintain the MER result on Cross Country)
- Not more than 75 seconds exceeding the optimum time in the Cross-Country Test for, two, three and four star level Competitions and 100 seconds in the case of five star level Competitions.

c) Jumping Test: not more than 16 penalties at obstacles.

NOTE: All MERs obtained in previous years will be counted according to the rules in place at that time.

### FEI PRIZE GIVING PROTOCOLE AT YOUNG HORSES CHAMPIONSHIPS

This Policy is based on the principle that at FEI Young Horses Championships, the horse is the World Champion and not the human athlete.

Consequently, the following applies:

- FEI-WBFSH Trophy (gold, silver and bronze) engraved with logos of FEI and WBFSH to be offered to the horse owner. If the horse owner is not present in the venue, the athlete must accept it on behalf of the horse owner. The Trophies will be provided by the FEI.
- Small FEI-WBFSH Trophy (gold, silver, bronze) engraved with logos of FEI and WBFSH to be offered to the athlete (text to be: athlete of the winner/second/third of the "FEI WBFSH [discipline] World Championships for Young Horses [year]"). The Trophies will be provided by the FEI.
- The WBFSH can provide recognitions/awards for the Breeder(s). These recognitions/awards will carry the logos of WBFSH and FEI.
- Horse owners and breeder must accompany the placed (or winning) horses or enter on the placed (or winning) carriages in driving. If the horse owner and/or breeder is not present at the venue he/she must be represented by the athlete.
- Horses must enter the arena wearing the blanket, a sash around the horses' neck and a big rosette on the sash at the level of the chest (gold, silver bronze). Blanket, sashes and rosettes applicable if provided by the OC. The correct name of the Championship needs to be included (or embroidered/printed) on the blankets/sashes and rosettes.
- The national flags (no studbook flags) to be used at the prize giving ceremony are the ones of the countries of the studbooks of the first 3 placed horses.
- In addition it is allowed to hoist the flag of the studbook of the winning horse in addition to the national flag.
- The national anthem to be played is the one of the country of the studbook of the winning horse.
- Longines shall have the right to offer watches to the Athletes.
- The organiser shall have the possibility to offer additional recognitions or special prizes (to be agreed in conjunction with the FEI).

French health authorities, veterinarians, and the Mondial du Lion organizing committee inform you that every horse participating at the venue must:

- Carry a valid FEI passport and its identification document.
- Be up to date with influenza vaccinations (the same applies to any other equid accompanying a participating horse). In accordance with FEI Veterinary Regulations, details of equine influenza vaccinations must be recorded in the FEI HorseApp for all FEI horses, in addition to being entered in the horse's passport.
- Horse temperatures –Self-Certification Form: FEI Veterinary Regulations require the submission of the "Self-Certification Form" and the recording of temperatures for horses participating in international competitions via the FEI HorseApp.

For each horse, you must therefore ensure the following:

- Two daily temperature readings during the 3 days prior to the horse's arrival at the competition venue, as well as throughout the entire duration of its stay at the venue.
- The "Self-Certification Form" must be completed within the 24 hours prior to the horse's arrival at the competition venue.

Reminder of the procedure:

- Log in to the FEI Horse App (ensure the app is updated)
- Select the relevant horse(s) under the "My Horses" tab
- Open the "Horse Health" tab and click on "Temperature"
- Enter the temperatures, specifying the time of each reading

We recommend entering temperatures for all horses that might participate in the competition, in case of a horse substitution.

### **2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

#### **GENERAL**

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit, free from infectious disease and meet the FEI's health requirements before being allowed to compete.

The DDPP of Maine-et-Loire (the French sanitary authority) informs competitors and the organizer of the health requirements applicable to horses participating in the Mondial du Lion 2026 equestrian competition.

### **A- Bringing horses into French territory**

Upon arrival, any operator bringing in one or more horses must possess:

#### **1. For horses coming from the EU and Northern Ireland**

##### **• An EU intra-Community health official certificate**

Certificate template is available to operators via the Traces NT application (Trade Control and Expert System New Technology: <https://webgate.ec.europa.eu/tracesnt/login>), signed by the official health authorities' documents from the country of departure:

- "EQUI-INTRA-CON" template for multiple horses, or
- "EQUI-INTRA-IND" template for a single horse.

Since July 1, 2022, European health certificates in Traces NT may be presented either in printed form or in electronic format. If the operator does not print the certificate, they must ensure it can be displayed electronically to anyone requesting it.

Article 92.2 of Delegated Regulation 2020/688 grants a derogation regarding the validity of the health certificate for horses holding a valid FEI passport (and thus meeting specific health conditions), allowing for:

- An extension of the validity period for the "EQUI-INTRA-IND" health certificate (for a single horse) from 10 to 30 days,
- The possibility of entering various Member States during this 30-day period, combined with an obligation to return to the establishment of departure.

A single health certificate is thus sufficient for the round trip and any movements between Member States involving the horse during the certificate's 30-day validity period.

**Note: Tripartite and bipartite agreements and DOCOMs are no longer in use.**

#### **-For horses coming from SWITZERLAND (specific requirement regarding the certificate's signature) :**

Movements involving European Free Trade Association (EFTA) countries (Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, and Switzerland) are subject to the same requirements as intra-EU movements.

An original paper Traces NT intra-Community health certificate signed by the health authorities at the place of departure is required; electronic certificates (Ecs) are not available (as the Traces NT electronic signature is not recognized by the Swiss authorities).

Health certificates for the horse's journey to and from Switzerland must be issued via the Traces NT application.

#### **2. For horses originating from third countries using TRACES NT: United Kingdom, Russia, EAEU [Customs Union countries], Canada, Chile, New Zealand**

- Electronic signatures are now authorized in TRACES NT for health certificates for horses originating from the United Kingdom. Electronic health certificates (eCS) may be presented in printed or digital format. If the operator does not print the certificate, they must ensure that it can be displayed in digital format to anyone requesting it.

- An original, valid, and signed paper official health certificate must be used for other countries.

**3. For horses coming from third countries that do not use TRACES NT:**

Horses must arrive with an original, signed paper official health certificate issued by the official health authorities of their place of departure. Depending on the country, consult Expadon/FranceAgrimer for official templates.

**B- Procedures regarding the return of horses to their country:**

**1. Return to an EU country**

For horses returning to the EU: if the horse's initial health certificate is more than 30 days old, or if the horse is returning to an EU country other than the one of departure following the equestrian competition, a new EU health certificate must be issued.

Official certificate template available to operators on the TRACES NT application (TRAdE Control and Expert System New Technology: <https://webgate.ec.europa.eu/tracesnt/login>), signed by the official health authorities of the country of departure (DDPP 49).

**2. For return to third countries:**

A new health certificate is required, validated by the official authorities of the country of departure (DDPP 49).

**- For the United Kingdom**, the certificate templates available in TRACES NT (EU Export) are:

- Re-entry after temporary export of a registered or non-registered equid – GBHC660 (v1.0)
- (GB) Temporary or permanent admission of a registered equid from the EU – GBHC661 (v1.1)

**- For Northern Ireland**: certificate templates in TRACES NT (EU Intra / select "United Kingdom (Northern Ireland)" in box I.9 "Country of destination"):

- "EQUI-INTRA-CON" template for multiple horses, or
- "EQUI-INTRA-IND" template for a single horse.

**- Other third countries:**

The health certificate template for the horse's departure depends on the destination country (consult the certificate template on Expadon 2/FranceAgriMer regarding destination country requirements).

=> All health and customs procedures must be completed prior to the competition by the rider or the freight forwarder /transporter.

=> Official validation of the health certificate for a horse leaving French territory will be carried out by the Maine-et-Loire DDPP (Departmental Directorate for the Protection of Populations), upon presentation of the animal's passport and a clinical examination performed within the preceding 48 hours by an official veterinarian.

**PLEASE NOTE:** For horses departing for the United Kingdom, the clinical examination must be performed on the same day the TRACES NT certificate is validated.

=> All health documents (passports + transport health certificate) for each horse must be handed in at the rider reception area immediately upon arrival.

=> A veterinary inspection of the horses upon arrival is scheduled for Tuesday, October 13, from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the stables.

=> **Any horse found to be non-compliant will be excluded from the competition.**

As the health, administrative, and even customs requirements for horse transport are extensive and significant, please take note of this information, share it with your riders, and emphasize the need for everyone to be vigilant and proactive in ensuring these requirements are met!

The Mondial du Lion organizers will not handle any of these procedures (please consult your freight forwarder or transporter).

### **3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

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### **4. PONIES**

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IX: For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement if requested by the FEI.

### **5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE**

FEI Veterinary Regulations Chapter VIII: Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post mortem examination.

### **6. TRANSPORT OF HORSES**

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for infectious disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation.

### **7. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE**

#### **7.1 PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ARTICLE 137)**

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation. All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI. FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events. NB: Horses entered in CIMs and in CSIP in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (GRs 137.2). Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations and may not be allowed to compete. NB: for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

#### **7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1003)**

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

#### **7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLE 1029)**

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by an FEI veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip (where present), their vaccination status and met the FEI's health requirements to access the FEI Stables Area. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, infectious disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue. PRs must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp in advance of the event which will be checked at the Examination on Arrival.

#### **7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLES 1032-1040)**

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

#### **7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS, ART. 1046-1051 AND ANNEX VIII)**

Horses may be subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

### **8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)**

#### **8.1 SAMPLING (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS CHAPTER VII)**

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

#### **8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLES 1056)**

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances. Please refer to <https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/horses> for information and details.

### **XIII. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING**

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Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

## **XIV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

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### **1. MEDICAL INFORMATION FORM FOR ARMBANDS**

#### Declaration of medical condition

Athletes with medical conditions that may be relevant in the case of a medical emergency are responsible, at every Event when riding, for wearing a medical data carrier\* from a system provider able to communicate information at least in English. Alternatively (and at the minimum) a medical armband of good quality can be used. Athletes who chose to wear an armband should download and fill the form available for this purpose on the FEI's website <http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/officials/eventing/forms>.

*\* Medical data carrier (also called "medical identification tag"): small emblem or tag worn on a bracelet, neck chain, or on the clothing, intended to alert paramedics/physicians/ first responders that the wearer has an important medical condition.*

Conditions that are relevant include recent head injury, serious past injuries/surgery, chronic health problems such as diabetes, long-term medications and allergies. If in doubt, the athlete should discuss this with his own treating physician."

### **2. INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

#### **2.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL**

##### **2.1.1 Personal accident and health insurance**

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses, which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

##### **2.1.2 Press equipment**

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

##### **2.1.3 Personal property insurance**

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage, which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place, which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

#### **2.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS**

##### **2.2.1 Third party liability insurance**

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support

Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

#### **2.2.2 Additional liability information**

#### **2.2.3 Horse insurance**

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

### **3. PROTESTS / APPEALS**

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent, as mentioned in the FEI General Regulations (Art. 161-162) available at the following link: <https://inside.fei.org/content/general-regs-statutes>.

### **4. DISPUTES**

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

### **5. MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the Organiser may change the schedule in order to clarify any matter arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Technical Delegate.

### **6. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER**

### **8. PRIZE MONEY DISTRIBUTION**

#### **IMPORTANT**

**The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (FEI General Regulations articles 127 and 128)**

The value of the **1st prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money** distributed for the competition. The minimum number of prizes offered for each competition must be allocated on the basis of one prize for every commenced four Athletes, with a minimum of five prizes.

#### **DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS**

**Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for Organisers to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.**

**The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the Organiser prior to departing.**

## **XV. ANNEXES**

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### **1. STEWARDING**

If an athlete is uncertain as to whether the boots he/she intends to use during an event are allowed, he/she or his/her representative should show the boots to the Chief Steward for his/her opinion before the boots are used in training or in competition.

In addition, athletes are to be made aware that hind boots must be removed and placed again on the horse's legs in the presence of a Steward while in the warm-up arena prior to entering the competition arena for certain competitions. (If bandages are used in place of boots, athletes are not required to remove the bandages in the warm-up arena.) This procedure is compulsory for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory, that is the Nations Cup, Championships, and the competition with the highest prize money, and is at the discretion of the Chief Steward for other competitions.

As an alternative to carrying out this procedure at the time designated by the Steward an athlete may ask his/her groom to take the boots to the in-gate and place them on the horse's legs in front of the Steward prior to the combination entering the arena.

The Steward has the authority to intervene if a boot is deemed excessively tight by instructing that the boot be removed and put on again correctly. [Stewards are to note that it is normal for a horse's gait to be somewhat affected immediately after boots have been removed and re-placed.] If an athlete or his/her groom refuses to remove and re-place the boot(s) when instructed to do so by the Steward, a Yellow Warning Card will be issued to the athlete in question.

If it is deemed impossible or unsafe to remove the hind boots in the warm-up arena prior to the combination entering the competition arena, due to an extremely excited or nervous horse, the boots of the horse in question are to be removed by the athlete/groom following the athlete's round upon leaving the arena and inspected by the Steward. This inspection may be carried out during the boot and bandage control if the boot and bandage control is carried out for the competition in question.

This procedure does not replace boot and bandage control after completion of an athlete's round for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory (refer to JRs Art. 244.1)
